▼I have just finished Players with my 9th grade resource English class. I wanted to let you know how much we enjoyed the novel. My kids were excited and couldn't wait to find out what happened next. Whenever I wanted to stop and ask questions, they wanted me to hush so they could continue listening to the story (I read most of it aloud to them although they read some aloud as well). We enjoyed reading the AJC article about the author, as well.

There were so many techniques and concepts we explored – setting, conflict, part of plot, prediction, sequencing, compare/contrast, point of view, and allusion, to name a few. And we spent lots of time on various aspects of characterization. My kids (in addition to study guide questions, vocabulary, and quizzes) constructed a matrix comparing traits of the major characters such as physical appearance, "things" they were good at, their dislikes, their "wants," and finally, what they each learned. For the final assessment, they wrote five paragraph essays comparing three different characters in one of three areas: a) how events changed their lives; b) how they changed personally throughout the novel; or, c) how they acted as "Players" in the novel. The essays won't make anybody's list of great literature, but I'm excited because they actually discuss a topic, draw conclusions, and generally make sense!

Thanks again for giving us permission to read the novel in advance of publication. Hopefully, *Players* will soon be on "required" reading lists everywhere!
